Faculty Research Incentive Program

The Faculty Incentive Program (FIP) applies to all UCCS tenured and tenure-track faculty serving as a PI or Co-PI on an externally-funded sponsored program that recovers Facilities and Administrative (F&A) costs at the sponsoring agency's publicly available written rate and funds the PI or Co-PI salary. The faculty member will draw salary from the sponsored program account proportionate to the amount included in the grant/contract, thereby creating funds for this incentive program. Incentive payments will be 75% of the net amount recovered and available for distribution. Payment is distributed as a lump sum in the fall of the following academic year.
